M A J O R	<p><u>Not limited to but includes the following:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Defiance/Disrespect/Insubordination/Non-Compliance • Abusive/Inappropriate Language or Actions/Swearing • Pushing, Shoving, Grabbing, Punching, Poking, Tackling • Biting w/o Mark • Lying/Cheating • Inappropriate Technology Use (Law Enforcement may be contacted as appropriate and suspension of technology privileges could occur.) 	<p>Defiance/Disrespect/Insubordination/Non-Compliance: Constitutes refusal to follow directions, talking back and/or socially rude interactions.</p> <p>Abusive/Inappropriate Language or Actions/Swearing: Verbal, written, electronic, or physical symbolism that includes slang, swearing, name calling or use of words in an inappropriate way and directed at an individual.</p> <p>Lying/Cheating: Student delivers messages that are untrue and/or deliberately violates rules of participates in academic dishonesty.</p> <p>Inappropriate Technology Use: Possessing, accessing, using, or sharing cell phones, pagers, or other electronic devices which are unnecessary for school purposes during the school day, including using cameras in bathrooms and locker rooms. Administration reserves the right to search and seize all electronic devices on school property or when held by a student during school hours or during school-sponsored activities. There is no assumption of privacy.</p> <p>Guidance Counselor Referral: A mandatory counseling meeting between the student and the counselor to discuss problems relating to the offense committed.</p> <p>Behavior Plan: A document outlining appropriate behavior and consequences that will be enforced for inappropriate behavior. Contracts will progress from minor consequences to those more severe. This includes illegal confiscation of the school's or another student's computer files and documents.</p> <p>Destruction of Minor Property: Student deliberately impairs the usefulness of property.</p> <p>Bullying: Teasing, taunting, coercive behavior, humiliation, inappropriate comments or similar conduct that occurs repeatedly over time and constitutes interference with an individual's rights or school purposes.</p> <p>Physical Aggression/Fighting: Intentional actions involving serious physical contact where injury may occur (e.g. hitting, punching, kicking, hair pulling, scratching, choking, etc.).</p> <p>Harassment, Teasing, Taunting; Threatening: Student delivers disrespectful messages (verbal, written, gestural) to another person with direct intent that includes threats and intimidation, obscene gestures, pictures, or written notes. This includes illegal confiscation of the school's or another student's computer files and documents. The value of this is up to \$499.</p> <p>Destruction of Major Property: Student deliberately impairs the usefulness of property. The value of this up to \$499.</p> <p>Assault (Physical or Verbal): A physical blow to another or conduct that threatens the immediate harm of another.</p> <p>Intimidation/Threats that Cause Fear: Use of coercion, force, threats, violence, intimidation, or similar conduct that constitutes a threat to a person's safety or interferes with school purposes.</p> <p>Inappropriate Technology Use-Major: Possessing, accessing, using, or sharing cell phones, pagers, or other electronic devices which are unnecessary for school purposes during the school day, including using cameras in bathrooms and locker rooms. Administration reserves the right to search and seize all electronic devices on school property or when held by a student during school hours or during school-sponsored activities. There is no assumption of privacy. At this level, the information is sexual or violent in nature.</p> <p>Leaving without Authorization: Leaving the elementary building, classroom, school-sponsored trip or field trip to go to another place without permission or without checking out of the office with staff authorization. M A J O R	<p><u>Not limited to but includes the following:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Alcohol/Drug Consumption/Possession • Arson • Endangerment to Life • Grand Theft (Will probably also include paying for property.) • Weapons • Bomb Threat/False Alarm • Combustibles <p>*Level Five Offenses will result in a report/call to the authorities.</p> <p>**Level Five Offenses are done with malicious intent and result in bodily harm.</p>	<p>Alcohol/Drug Consumption/Possession: Student is in possession, under the influence of, or is using alcohol, illegal drugs or substances, or imitations of the above.</p> <p>Arson: Student plans and/or participates in malicious burning of property.</p> <p>Endangerment to Life: Any negligent or reckless behavior, terrorist threat, or hoax which could endanger a person's life or be capable of causing significant physical harm to an individual or the disruption of the school system.</p> <p>Grand Theft: Stealing or attempting to steal private or school property. This includes illegal confiscation of the school's or another student's computer files and documents.
